- The book Thirty: A Mother's Spiritual Journey After Losing Her Child by Carole J. Sluski.


SUGGESTED INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

- Wednesday, March 18, 1992, was an entirely chaotic and stressful day. Can you tell us a little bit about what you call in the book "The Beginning of the End"?
- How did you feel when you got the call from the hospital and the doctor said Paula had been admitted to the ER early in the morning at 2:00 a.m.?
- What was the first thing you did when you arrived at the hospital? Did you feel hopeless and did you reach out to God at this point?
- How did you deal with the guilt of not going to her house the evening before when you talked to Paula?
- Mentally and emotionally, you were very quiet, tired, and heartbroken. You kept your emotions, thoughts, and feelings under control in front of everyone else around you. Internally, how were you really feeling?
- How was the decision process of letting Paula off the life support system?
- After the service and everything that immediately followed after her death, how were the first couple of months for you?
- When did you realize that healing was possible?
- When did you decide you were going to write the book and why name it *Thirty*?
- Knowing your God and that the Holy Spirit is for real, do you think you will see Paula again in Heaven?

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
